Welcome from Andrea Stephens

Dear Families

Many Minds, One Mission

Never has our new school mantra seemed so important.

Throughout the pandemic, we have been very much interconnected. The importance of community and partnership – the legacy and the beating heart of Colton Hills Community School – has been alive and provided powerful encouragement to our young people. During the course of the past academic year, we have collaborated without fuss and without nonsense and put the effort in to support each other, with excellent results. As a Colton Hills community, each one of us understands that we enrich our own lives by giving to others, and I have witnessed this as our natural behaviour throughout the past year.

However, it would be entirely wrong not to acknowledge the genuine hardship and loss that so many in our community have suffered during the Covid outbreak. It has taken lives and livelihoods and changed the landscape for so many. Nor should we overlook the many injustices that have been highlighted worldwide this year, including, more recently, the racist abuse that targeted some of our most talented footballers. The black lives movement highlighted many injustices worldwide, including within our education system. The concerns that have been raised about prejudice and privilege are not unique to Colton Hills. We are proud of our diverse community and resolve to do what is necessary to live up to the promise of tackling social injustice and challenging prejudice so that everyone thrives. These issues are high on our agenda in the coming academic year.

It is also crucial for me to highlight our students' determination, respect, and focus, which has been astonishing. With the guidance and support of our staff and parents, they have kept going, even under periods of intense pressure. Unlike any other year, schools have faced the challenge of finding new ways to deliver breadth and depth in the curriculum. In our most recent assessments, I have been delighted to see that the core learning foundations have remained in place at Colton Hills, and the educational diet has been broad, challenging and exciting for students. The weight on public exam cohorts, now awaiting Teacher Assessed Grades, has been acute. Through it all, learning has been lively, clubs and interventions have thrived, and science competitions and challenges have been mastered.

As the holiday approaches, we can be deeply proud of our whole school family and what we have achieved together.

At the end of another school year, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the students for their effort, resilience and achievements in 2021.

I would also like to thank staff for their commitment and hard work and parents and carers for your continued support of Colton Hills School and our students.

In the news - students receive book celebrating 100 Great Black Britons

In June we were thrilled to be asked to support a national campaign by Yvonne Davis, a retired primary school headteacher from Wolverhampton, to get books into every school in Britain being run by Wolverhampton Council and Trade Union Council.

Councillor Dr Michael Hardacre, Cabinet Member for Education and Skills and Nick Kelleher, Secretary of the Wolverhampton, Bilston and District Trades Union Council came into school to deliver a copy of "100 Great Black Britons", which they are supplying to every school in the region.



100 Great Black Britons, by Patrick Vernon and Dr Angelina Osborne, celebrates the lives, stories, achievements and contributions of key Black British individuals over history.

Pennfields-born author, broadcaster and social commentator Patrick Vernon was once a pupil at Colton Hills and he said: "It is a fantastic honour that the City of Wolverhampton Council has acquired copies of the best-selling 100 Great Black Britons for all schools and libraries in Wolverhampton.

"I am proud of my roots in Wolverhampton, and I hope the book and my achievements will inspire young people that they can make a difference with their lives and be proud of our shared history. I am hoping to go back to Colton Hills, and also my primary school Grove Junior, during Black History Month so I can share my work with pupils."

Among those featured are pioneering nurse and heroine of the Crimean War, Mary Seacole, artist and film director Steve McQueen, rapper Stormzy, Booker prize-winning author Bernardine Evaristo, Formula One driver Lewis Hamilton, comedian Dudley-born Lenny Henry and Wolverhampton-born singer Beverley Knight. At Colton Hills, our 2020 Black History Month campaign highlighted inspiring black British stories, with students having a daily assembly about one of these icons.

Mrs Stephens said "Books like this help highlight some of the most pioneering Black Britons who have achieved and helped shape our history as a result.

"It is incredibly empowering to see that one of the authors was a student at Colton Hills, which is a great way to illustrate to our children that, through hard work and resilience, they too can do anything and shape this world for the better. We are really proud to be part of this initiative and look forward to using the book for many years to come."

The students were happy to receive the book, and we are so proud of Patrick Vernon for co-authoring such an important work.

Combined Cadet Force Field Day

From Mr Ireland Wing Commander

Our Combined Cadet unit (CCF) attended a Field Day at Nescliffe Training Area in June and 20 cadets made the short trip to experience what a full army camp is like. It was a demanding day full of challenge and the cadets thoroughly enjoyed the event.

There was a round robin of 8 activities in a full day held by our local Cadet Training Team:

Using the new Cadet Radio Systems to send BATCO (Battle Code) coded messages over the radio to inform command of their location without the enemy knowing where they are.

Anti-ambush drills with paintball guns, working as a team to withdraw to a safe location under enemy fire.

Stalking, using camouflage and terrain to approach a target without being spotted.

Laser shot gun range, just like real clay pigeon shooting but without the danger of real shells.

Shooting the Cadet Scorpion Air Rifle with some impressive cards from those who had not even fired before. This bodes well moving into the post-covid world when we can get back on the Cadet GP Rifles and I can see me needing to order plenty of marksman badges next year.

Mountain biking with a short familiarisation ride around the training area then the obstacle course to see who was the fastest.







The 'gun run' was the most physically demanding event requiring cadets to haul a heavy field gun around a course, change wheels, dismantle the gun to get it through a small gap, all on the clock.

The final event was the 'Avenger Challenge' where cadets had to solve a number of demanding mental challenges to get as many 'energy stones' as possible to complete the task.

After a year of not being able to get out for CCF, this day gave us a tantalising taste of what is available next year. We have recruited over 100 new Year 9s and Year 10s next year which will mean an exciting future lies ahead for our new CCF unit at school.

- 1-to-1 Mock interviews with a range of local employers








Team W.A.S.P secure 3rd place in Solutions for the Planet!

On 23rd June Team W.A.S.P represented Colton Hills at the national finals of the Solutions for the Planet Big Ideas competition. Despite having to face the challenge of two team members having to join remotely – meaning last minute changes to their pitch – they did an amazing presentation and secured 3rd place in the competition.

Success for our scientists in The Biology Challenge

The Biology Challenge is a national competition open to 13- to 15-year-old students, who compete in two invigilated online papers. Last year 47,336 students from 576 schools took part.

We have entered students every year for the past seven years and have often had students attain Commended or Highly Commended certificates. This year we have two Commended, two highly Commended and, for the first time, four students have won a certificate from the Royal Society of Biology for attaining Silver and Bronze scores, which is a fantastic achievement.

Over the last half term, I have thoroughly enjoyed visiting many of our local primary schools to meet the year 6s that will be joining us in September.




There are exciting times ahead, and we are looking forward to taking the next steps of our journey together as a school community.
